it,
Dee

Josiah (son of William & Elizabeth #3). Married Ann Pendious 1/3/1840 & he
was christened 23/4/1821. William (son of William & Ann) Married Elizabeth
Kimberley 5/9/1812 & he was christened on 25/12/1792. William (son of
William & Elizabeth #2) Married Ann Smith 25/6/1792 & he was christened
14/9/1771. William (son of William & Elizabeth) Married Elizabeth Lewis
17/11/1770, he was christened on 25/5/1750. William (son of William & Mary)
married Elizabeth Grove 29/9/1742, he was christened on 5/2/1720 or 1721.
William BING married Mary Buckstone at Alvechurch 27/5/1705. That's as far
back as I go. All these William's & Elizabeth's !!! One can get very confused
so I hope you can make all this out. It also looks like the BYNG name
originates from BING. It seems to have changed with a different vicar around
the time of Josiah (the eldest) baptism
